..... Meanwhile, Premier Lorne Calvert offered condolences to London and Muslims for Peace and Justice (MPJ) expressed frustration.

"We have unequivocally condemned this act. We consider it to be most regrettable and we are angry that these kinds of things are still happening and some Muslim entities are claiming responsibility of this," said MPJ President Riazuddin Ahmed.

In spite of the horror of Thursday's events and people's fear of terrorism, Ahmed said he is not afraid of all Muslims being blamed.

"The larger majority of Canadians understand that it is a very small fringe group which is doing the major damage, not only to the security of people and society at large, but also the Muslim community," he said.

In honour of those injured and killed in London Thursday, flags were lowered to half-staff at provincial and federal government buildings across Saskatchewan.
