According to the *Seattle Times*, the charged men followed the teachings of the Moorish Science Temple of America. According to another article in the *Florida Sun-Sentinel*, two of the accused were involved in Bible studies and went regularly to church. Their origins are said to be in 1913 and Moorish Temple members trace their ancestry to Morocco. They claim to be a sect of Islam, but have very different core beliefs.
